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SUBJECT: WPAI POLL SHOWS LIZ CHENEY CONTINUES TO BE IN SERIOUS RE-ELECTION TROUBLE

DATE: JULY 23, 2021

A WPA Intelligence poll conducted on behalf of Club for Growth PAC in Wyoming from July 20-22, 2021, shows that Liz Cheney continues to be in serious trouble in her race for re-election to Congress with growing unfavorable ratings among Republican primary voters and a majority of Republican primary voters committed to voting against her in a primary.

Liz Cheney's unfavorable ratings among Republican primary voters continue to grow.

- Unfavorable ratings of Liz Cheney among Republican primary voters continue to grow, up five points since April and with 70% of primary voters now viewing her unfavorably.
- Just 26% of Republican primary voters have favorable impressions of Liz Cheney.

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Wyoming Republican primary voters remain committed to replacing Liz Cheney regardless of who runs against her.

- A majority of Wyoming Republican primary voters (53%) would replace Liz Cheney regardless of who her opponent is.
- Another 27% would consider another candidate.
- Just 17% are committed to re-electing Cheney to Congress.

Methodology

WPAi conducted a poll of n = 409 likely Republican primary voters in Wyoming. Interviews were conducted by live telephone interviewers July 20-22, 2021; 60% of the interview were conducted to cell phones and 40% to landline phones. The sample was selected from the Wyoming voter file and stratified by geography, age, gender, and vote history to ensure a representative sample of the likely primary electorate. The survey has a margin of error of $\pm 4.9\%$ at the 95% confidence level.
